New Algebra Course

In collaboration with the Special Education Department, the Mathematics Department is happy to be offering a new course called Algebra 1 Foundations 1.

This class is currently being taught by Mrs. Charlotte Cavataro from the Math Department and Mrs. Lisa Reichin from the Special Education Department. Algebra 1 is the most essential math course students take, and, therefore time is being spent solidifying those skills needed for future courses. In previous years, we found that some of our students were unable to keep up with the pace of CPB Algebra 1. Algebra 1 Foundations 1 and Algebra 1 Foundations 2 will take the CPB Algebra 1 curriculum and spread it out over two years. The extra time will be used to embed a deeper explanation of foundational math concepts. Students who successfully complete Alg 1 Foundations 1 will be enrolled in Alg 1 Foundations 2.

Next Generation Science Standards

NGSS comes to NHS!

The Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) are here. They are being implemented in our freshman classes this year, and our science teachers are spending most of their professional development time learning how to interpret the standards and how to design lessons that are aligned with NGSS. The State of Connecticut implementation timeline calls for the standards to be implemented next year in 10th grade and the following year in 11th grade, and a pilot of the NGSS assessment (which will replace the CAPT test) will be given this year to juniors.

Last May, science teachers Baumgartner, Canfield, DeJulio, Georgina, McConnell, and Paulsson attended *Teaching and Learning in 3D- An Orientation to the NGSS* at The Capitol Regional Education Council (CREC) in Hartford, three days over the course of three weeks. This workshop provided a good foundation for understanding how to use the standards.



Last month, Mr. Canfield joined a group of science teachers from the other Newtown schools to attend the National Science Teachers Association area conference in Baltimore, where they went to several sessions about various aspects of NGSS,

particularly the identification of anchoring phenomena and storylines, NGSS elements around which science lessons and units are to be built. On November 20 and 21, Mr. Canfield and Assistant Principal Kimberly Longobucco will attend the PLANS Workshop at the Connecticut Science Center where they hope to delve more deeply into the heart of NGSS.

Meanwhile, NHS science department meetings, and our science PLCs (Professional Learning Communities) will focus on NGSS throughout the year.




Also, Mr. Canfield, Mr. DeJulio, Mrs. Georgina, and Mrs. McConnell are part of the NGSS Leadership Team, a district committee of Newtown science leaders that meets monthly to address the schools' and district's needs as they work to implement NGSS in our science classrooms.

NGSS represents a big change in science education across the country and Newtown High School is part of it!

The Career Center is open from 7:30 am-3:00 pm, Monday through Friday. To schedule an appointment with either Mrs. Ragaini or Mrs. Latowicki, please call 203-426-7679. Please contact us if you require further information on anything included below.

The Career Center is a unique environment that has the resources to provide students with help in exploring their post-high school options and careers. It is located in the rear of the Counseling Office. We are committed to working with students to promote self-discovery through real world experiences. Our goal is to aid students in developing a plan for their future.

Students can access college, financial aid or career websites during their free periods or after school in the Career Center. Our computers are also accessible for students to use for schoolwork, during the day, as long as it is during a free period.

Unpaid Learning Experience Program

Formerly known as the NHS Internship Program

This program is open to juniors and seniors interested in exploring a career. The positions may be paid or unpaid. Students are placed in a position based on their interests, availability, and organization's schedule.

Students who meet the program requirements have the experience noted on their transcript. Students are asked to complete an application, work their scheduled thirty hours during the school year, attend a safety training, meet with me, and complete a simple reflection on their experience.

Applications are available in the Career Center and the **deadline** to submit an application for the current year is December 15.



Regional Healthcare Shadowing Program

Applications are now available for the 2018-2019 school year. This program accepts juniors and seniors interested in exploring healthcare careers. Accepted students shadow healthcare professionals observing and learning about the daily tasks of the job. The goal is for students to learn about different aspects of the industry and to learn about the skills necessary to be successful.

Students are selected based on the date their application was submitted, attendance at an informational meeting in May of their sophomore or junior year, and school attendance (including Advisory). Applications are available in the Career Center. Please see Mrs. Ragaini if you have any questions.



Career Shadows

This program allows junior and seniors one excused day per semester to spend time in a career field of their interest with a community

volunteer. It is hard to find volunteers for certain careers, but Mrs. Latowicki will always exhaust all her options when searching for a volunteer. Students should see Mrs. Latowicki in the Career Center to discuss Career Shadow options. **The deadline to apply for a Career Shadow is March 31.**

Scholarships

The scholarship list is updated on a regular basis. The list can be accessed in Naviance under the colleges tab and then scrolling to scholarship list on the bottom of the page. A listing of all

scholarships with full descriptions can be found on Naviance. All newly added scholarships will be marked with an asterisk. Most scholarships are for seniors graduating from high school, but there are an occasional few for underclassmen. The more scholarships a student applies for, the likelier it is they are to

receive a monetary award. As the school year moves into the winter and spring months, more local scholarships become available. Any student who needs assistance navigating the list in Naviance should stop into the Career Center to set up an appointment with Mrs. Latowicki. Please remember to check the list regularly.

Junior/Senior Projects

The Junior and Senior Project class provides the motivated and responsible junior or senior learner an opportunity to distinguish themselves by developing a career-oriented relationship with a community professional in the student's area of chosen interest. Participants are expected to be motivated and self-directed. The program requires that the Junior/Senior Project be an experience unavailable in the traditional classroom. This course counts as a fifth class for seniors and a sixth class for juniors. Examples of projects from past years include:
